First Lesson: Isaiah 60:1-6

The writer of today's gospel, Matthew, undoubtedly knew this poetry from Isaiah and builds his Epiphany story around it. In Jewish tradition, literal fulfillment of prophesy was presumed possible, but figurative applications also could be equally or more valid. For us as readers, the literal appearance of words like gold and frankincense foreshadow the Magi but are less important than the explosive good news of the first line, "Arise, shine, for your light has come!"

¹Arise, shine; for your light has come, and the glory of the Lord has risen upon you. ²For darkness shall cover the earth, and thick darkness the peoples; but the Lord will arise upon you, and his glory will appear over you. ³Nations shall come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your dawn.

⁴Lift up your eyes and look around; they all gather together, they come to you; your sons shall come from far away, and your daughters shall be carried on their nurses' arms.

⁵Then you shall see and be radiant; your heart shall thrill and rejoice,

because the abundance of the sea shall be brought to you,

the wealth of the nations shall come to you.

⁶A multitude of camels shall cover you, the young camels of Midian and Ephah; all those from Sheba shall come.

They shall bring gold and frankincense, and shall proclaim the praise of the Lord.

Here ends the reading.

The Magi seek a king not their own, they persist against all odds in finding him, and in witness to the essence of the Nativity, they experience overwhelming joy when they find him. In a world of so much hurt, the Magi still travel alongside all of us, bringing the best of treasures: healing and hope.

For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage." ³When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him; ⁴and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. ⁵They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet:

6'And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel.'"

Then Herod secretly called for the wise men and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. ⁸Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage." ⁹When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. ¹⁰When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. ¹¹On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. ¹²And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.

UNITY Highlights

2023 Finances in Review. UNITY finished 2023 on a strong giving note and will end the year with a surplus of around \$30,000 when all the final accounting is complete. Giving to our operating budget was up 2.2% compared to 2022. Because we also finished with a surplus in 2022, it means we broke an established trend of a surplus one year followed by a deficit the next. It also means member giving has returned to giving levels not seen since UNITY'S first year in 2017. Recognizing the intervening impact of COVID and the passing of many long-time members, the past two years reflect strong support by both existing and newer members of the congregation. These are all healthy trends in the life of UNITY and gives us a strong starting point for the year to come. Thank you many times over to everyone who prays, volunteers, and financially supports the ministries of our congregation. All of it is both a gift and a recognition of the discipleship we share.

Scholarships: UNITY Church has four (4) \$1,000 education scholarships available for our high school students applying to college or current college students, who are attending a University, College, or Institution of higher education this year. Priority is given to anyone attending a Lutheran college or university, or majoring in nursing or engineering. Lent As Shared Faith Exploration. Our overall theme for Lent this year is: Bloom! Growing Healthier Yourself and Making It Healthier for Others Too. Our Worship & Music team is excited about this theme because "health" has both personal and social determinants which makes it a lot like faith. Our Adult Programs team is excited because the idea of blooming where we're planted is a great place to focus our spiritual attention during Lent. Could you play a small role in that focus for Lent? We plan to create daily faith explorations, or devotions, for Lent that will be emailed to anyone who signs up for them...a plan similar to what we've done in the past. What we need is YOU to read them and hopefully write one too. Why would you write one of these? Did you know yours is a perspective which maybe no one else will bring? It's true. They're short (about 250 words). They can be personally reflective or quote statistics. They can be a small story from your own life or a dive into a bible passage. We will post the weekly themes within the overall theme. You could choose to write on one day of a particular week based on what interests you. This is a deeper-than-superficial way for us to speak and listen to each other. Watch for more to come and please be one of the 49 authors (40 days of Lent, six Sundays of Lent, and the 3 days we know as ... Good Friday, Saturday, and Easter Sunday) of these important ways to grow together in faith...that is, Bloom!

Upcoming Need/s for Lent. Help! We could use some extra help in the following areas. Please talk to a pastor or Lynn or Nancy in the office if you can help.

- Lent suppers are coming. The CTK system is pretty well set but at COL we could use someone who would be the Lent supper guru! Small groups and individuals will serve and cook but we need someone who can make sure there are shoppers and can be here on most or all Wednesdays during Lent from 4:30-6:30 to make sure things are going smoothly. It's a five week job and super (or is that supper) rewarding! (If two people want to split the role, that's fine too) Weeks are Wednesdays, February 21-March 20.

- A similar request for 1 or 2 people who could be on hand to oversee food serving and general flow on Tuesday for our Lent For Littles Program. This is a meal and craft for households with children in elementary school and younger, some of whom will also spend time with the children's choirs that rehearse that night. Time range is **4:30-6:30 and dates are Tuesdays**, February 20-March 19.

Call Team will be "commissioned" January 27/28. Please keep them in your prayers! The call team has begun their work, learning about how the process works to search and call next pastors, and preparing to compile UNITY's Ministry Site Profile (MSP), a detailed document that conveys who we are as a church to potential candidates, with everything from church financial history, area demographics, staffing structure, priorities and mission. The group is made up of 8 "at large" members plus reps from youth, the HR team, council, and the pastors. They are committed and big-hearted people from a wide variety of backgrounds who all trust God and care deeply about our community. We will do a little "commissioning" service for them at all worship services January 27 and 28, with a laying on of hands, a charge to the work, and a reminder of the support of this church and presence of our God with them as they do it. They appreciate all the prayers already being lifted on their behalf. We give thanks for all the good people in this place, and those yet to come! First Lesson: 1 Corinthians 8:1-13

At the time of the apostle Paul, Corinth was a multicultural seaport; a complex and curious place. Every faith answer Paul shared with the Corinthians resulted in the next question. Chapter 8 deals with this particular dilemma: If you eat meat that has previously been offered as a sacrifice in a pagan temple, does that send the message you as a Christian also believe in the pagan god? And if so, should you care?

¹Now concerning food sacrificed to idols: we know that "all of us possess knowledge." Knowledge puffs up, but love builds up. ²Anyone who claims to know something does not yet have the necessary knowledge; ³but anyone who loves God is known by him.

⁴Hence, as to the eating of food offered to idols, we know that "no idol in the world really exists," and that "there is no God but one." ⁵Indeed, even though there may be so-called gods in heaven or on earth—as in fact there are many gods and many lords—⁶yet for us there is one God, the Father, from whom are all things and for whom we exist, and one Lord, Jesus Christ, through whom are all things and through whom we exist.

7It is not everyone, however, who has this knowledge. Since some have become so accustomed to idols until now, they still think of the food they eat as food offered to an idol; and their conscience, being weak, is confused. 8"Food will not bring us close to God." We are no worse off if we do not eat, and no better off if we do. 9But take care that this liberty of yours does not somehow become a stumbling block to the weak. 10For if others see you, who possess knowledge, eating in the temple of an idol, might they not, since their conscience is weak, be encouraged to the point of eating food sacrificed to idols? 11So by your knowledge those weak believers for whom Christ died are destroyed. 12But when you thus sin against members of your family, and wound their conscience when it is weak, you sin against Christ. 13Therefore, if food is a cause of their falling, I will never eat meat, so that I may not cause one of them to fall.

UNITY Highlights

2023 Finances in Review. UNITY finished 2023 on a strong giving note and will end the year with a surplus of around \$30,000 when all the final accounting is complete. Giving to our operating budget was up 2.2% compared to 2022. Because we also finished with a surplus in 2022, it means we broke an established trend of a surplus one year followed by a deficit the next. It also means member giving has returned to giving levels not seen since UNITY'S first year in 2017. Recognizing the intervening impact of COVID and the passing of many long-time members, the past two years reflect strong support by both existing and newer members of the congregation. These are all healthy trends in the life of UNITY which have been reinforced by a 2024 Pledge Appeal that has now exceeded the goal of 300 pledges for the current year. Thank you many times over to everyone who prays, volunteers, and financially supports the ministries of our congregation. All of it is both a gift and a recognition of the discipleship we share.

Lent As Shared Faith Exploration. Our overall theme for Lent this year is: *Bloom! Growing Healthier Yourself and Making It Healthier for Others Too.* Our Worship & Music team is excited about this theme because "health" has both personal and social determinants which makes it a lot like faith. Our Adult Programs team is excited because the idea of blooming where we're planted is a great place to focus our spiritual attention during Lent.

Could you play a small role in that focus for Lent? We plan to create daily faith explorations, or devotions, for Lent that will be emailed to anyone who signs up for them....a plan similar to what we've done in the past. What we need is YOU to read them and hopefully write one too. Why would you write one of these? *Did you know yours is a perspective which maybe no one else will bring?* It's true. They're short (can be anywhere from 50-250 words). They can be personally reflective or quote statistics. They can be a small story from your own life or a dive into a bible passage. We will post the weekly themes within the overall theme. You could choose to write on one day of a particular week based on what interests you.

This is a deeper-than-superficial way for us to speak and listen to each other. Watch for more to come and please be one of the 49 authors (40 days of Lent, six Sundays of Lent, and the 3 days we know as ...Good Friday, Saturday, and Easter Sunday) of these important ways to grow together in faith...that is, *Bloom!*

Upcoming Need/s for Lent. Help! We could use some extra help in the following areas. Please talk to a pastor or Lynn or Nancy in the office if you can help.

- Lent suppers are coming. The CTK system is pretty well set but at COL we could use someone who would be the Lent supper guru! Small groups and individuals will serve and cook but we need someone who can make sure there are shoppers and can be here on most or all Wednesdays during Lent from 4:30-6:30 to make sure things are going smoothly. It's a five week job and super (or is that supper) rewarding! (If two people want to split the role, that's fine too) Weeks are Wednesdays, February 21-March 20.
- A similar request for 1 or 2 people who could be on hand to oversee food serving and general flow on Tuesday for our Lent For Littles Program. This is a meal and craft for households with children in elementary school and younger, some of whom will also spend time with the children's choirs that rehearse that night. Time range is **4:30-6:30 and dates** are Tuesdays, February **20-March 19**.
